Facts About Bullying

American schools harbor approximately 2.1 bullies and 2.7 million of their victims.

Bully victims are between 2 and 9 times more likely to consider suicide than non-victims according to studies by Yale University.

According to bullying statistics, 1 out of every 10 students who drop out of school do so because of repeated bullying.

1 out of 5 kids admits to being a bully or doing some bullying.

43% of kids have been bullied while online. 1 in 4 have had it happen more than once.

Children with disabilities are 2 to 3 times more likely to be bullied than their non-disabled peers.

More than 50% of bullying situations stop when a peer intervenes.
